- Different <u>assignments</u> call for different <u>strategies</u> Luke 7:33-35/ 1 Corinthians 9:19-23/ Luke 1:11-17 vs Luke 5:29-31
- If we're going to judge judge people and ministries by their <u>fruit</u> – not by our personal <u>preferences</u> and <u>assignment</u> Luke 7:33-35/ Luke 6:43-45/ Romans 14:1-23/ 1 Corinthians 12:14-22/ 1 John 2:3-5
