(Questions and Scriptures for further study)

1. Most houses have a manger scene that comes out every year during Christmas. After Christmas the manger gets packed back up with the rest of the Christmas décor and stored away until the next year. While mangers are a great tradition, there's a far greater purpose to the birth of Jesus that can be easily forgotten. How might the following verses broaden your view of the manger scene?

John 3:16-18

¹⁶ For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. ¹⁷ For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him. ¹⁸ Whoever believes in him is not condemned, but whoever does not believe stands condemned already because they have not believed in the name of God's one and only Son. [NIV]

John 6:38-39

³⁸ For I have come down from heaven not to do my will but to do the will of him who sent me. ³⁹ And this is the will of him who sent me, that I shall lose none of all those he has given me, but raise them up at the last day. [NIV]

John 10:10

¹⁰ The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full. [NIV]

John 12:46

 46 I have come into the world as a light, so that no one who believes in me should stay in darkness. $_{[NIV]}$

[NIV]

John 1:14

¹⁴ The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the one and only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth. [NIV]

John 14:6-7

 6 Jesus answered, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me. 7 If you really know me, you will know my Father as well. From now on, you do know him and have seen him." $_{[NIV]}$

John 5:17-18

 17 In his defense Jesus said to them, "My Father is always at his work to this very day, and I too am working." 18 For this reason they tried all the more to kill him; not only was he breaking the Sabbath, but he was even calling God his own Father, making himself equal with God. $_{[NIV]}$
