## **DIGGING DEEPER**

- 1. Knowing and understanding God's ultimate power in our life and our world makes a big difference in how we live out the hope we have in following him. When we can't see God's power in a situation, we can easily become pessimistic or shortsighted. How does 2 Kings 6:8-17 encourage you to remember that God's power is active beyond what we know?
- <sup>8</sup> Now the king of Aram was at war with Israel. After conferring with his officers, he said, "I will set up my camp in such and such a place."
- <sup>9</sup> The man of God sent word to the king of Israel: "Beware of passing that place, because the Arameans are going down there." <sup>10</sup> So the king of Israel checked on the place indicated by the man of God. Time and again Elisha warned the king, so that he was on his guard in such places.
- <sup>11</sup> This enraged the king of Aram. He summoned his officers and demanded of them, "Tell me! Which of us is on the side of the king of Israel?"
- <sup>12</sup> "None of us, my lord the king," said one of his officers, "but Elisha, the prophet who is in Israel, tells the king of Israel the very words you speak in your bedroom."
- <sup>13</sup> "Go, find out where he is," the king ordered, "so I can send men and capture him." The report came back: "He is in Dothan." <sup>14</sup> Then he sent horses and chariots and a strong force there. They went by

night and surrounded the city.

15 When the servant of the man of God got up and went out early the next morning, an army with horses and chariots had surrounded the city. "Oh no, my lord! What shall we do?" the servant asked. 16 "Don't be afraid," the prophet answered. "Those who are with us are more than those who are with them."

17 And Elisha prayed, "Open his eyes, Lord, so that he may see." Then the Lord opened the servant's eyes, and he looked and saw the hills full of horses and chariots of fire all around Elisha.[NIV]

That power is the same as the mighty strength [NIV]

#### Proverbs 2:1-11

Moral Benefits of Wisdom

- 2:1 My son, if you accept my words and store up my commands within you,
- <sup>2</sup> turning your ear to wisdom

and applying your heart to understanding—

- <sup>3</sup> indeed, if you call out for insight and cry aloud for understanding,
- 4 and if you look for it as for silver
- and search for it as for hidden treasure,
- <sup>5</sup> then you will understand the fear of the Lord and find the knowledge of God.
- <sup>6</sup> For the Lord gives wisdom;

from his mouth come knowledge and understanding.

- <sup>7</sup> He holds success in store for the upright, he is a shield to those whose walk is blameless,
- <sup>8</sup> for he guards the course of the just and protects the way of his faithful ones.
- <sup>9</sup> Then you will understand what is right and just and fair—every good path.
- 10 For wisdom will enter your heart,
  - and knowledge will be pleasant to your soul.
- <sup>11</sup> Discretion will protect you, and understanding will guard you. [NIV]
