WISDOM: It's not what you know, it's how you live.

- (3) What am I going to regret not doing the most?

#### **<u>1 Thing To Always Keep In Mind:</u>**

Proverbs 3:5-7/ Matthew 6:31-34

(1) God's will for my life is relational not rational.

In other words: God blesses disciples, not decisions.

**1.** This week Chris gave us three questions for godly decision-making and four more to ask when the decision continues to remain unclear. How do the following passages further impact our decision-making process?

## Colossians 3:17

<sup>17</sup> And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.  $_{[NIV]}$ 

## 1 Thessalonians 4:11-12

<sup>11</sup> and to make it your ambition to lead a quiet life: You should mind your own business and work with your hands, just as we told you, <sup>12</sup> so that your daily life may win the respect of outsiders and so that you will not be dependent on anybody. [NIV]

## 2 Peter 1:5-8

<sup>5</sup> For this very reason, make every effort to add to your faith goodness; and to goodness, knowledge; <sup>6</sup> and to knowledge, self-control; and to self-control, perseverance; and to perseverance, godliness; <sup>7</sup> and to godliness, mutual affection; and to mutual affection, love. <sup>8</sup> For if you possess these qualities in increasing measure, they will keep you from being ineffective and unproductive in your knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. <sub>[NIV]</sub>

**2.** King Rehoboam in the Old Testament made some critical mistakes in his decision making and leadership as a king. As you read his story in I Kings 12 & 14:21-30, jot down your observations on mistakes he made that violate what we heard this weekend regarding decision-making.

Now read James 3:13-18 and jot down what it says about the core characteristics of wisdom and how to discern advice worth listening to

#### James 3:13-18

#### Two Kinds of Wisdom

<sup>13</sup> Who is wise and understanding among you? Let them show it by their good life, by deeds done in the humility that comes from wisdom. <sup>14</sup> But if you harbor bitter envy and selfish ambition in your hearts, do not boast about it or deny the truth. <sup>15</sup> Such "wisdom" does not come down from heaven but is earthly, unspiritual, demonic. <sup>16</sup> For where you have envy and selfish ambition, there you find disorder and every evil practice.

<sup>17</sup> But the wisdom that comes from heaven is first of all pure; then peace-loving, considerate, submissive, full of mercy and good fruit, impartial and sincere. <sup>18</sup> Peacemakers who sow in peace reap a harvest of righteousness. [NIV]

Are there any adjustments you need to make when it comes to seeking counsel?

**3.** When we ask for wise counsel sometimes the word we receive can be difficult to hear. Read the following verses and make a list of some of the benefits of accepting "tough words said" as well as the dangers of ignoring them.

- <sup>20</sup> Out in the open wisdom calls aloud, she raises her voice in the public square;
- <sup>21</sup> on top of the wall she cries out, at the city gate she makes her speech:
- <sup>22</sup> "How long will you who are simple love your simple ways? How long will mockers delight in mockery and fools hate knowledge?
- <sup>23</sup> Repent at my rebuke!
   Then I will pour out my thoughts to you,
   I will make known to you my teachings.
- <sup>24</sup> But since you refuse to listen when I call and no one pays attention when I stretch out my hand,
- <sup>25</sup> since you disregard all my advice and do not accept my rebuke,
- <sup>26</sup> I in turn will laugh when disaster strikes you; I will mock when calamity overtakes you—
- <sup>27</sup> when calamity overtakes you like a storm,
   when disaster sweeps over you like a whirlwind,
   when distress and trouble overwhelm you.
- <sup>28</sup> "Then they will call to me but I will not answer; they will look for me but will not find me,
- <sup>29</sup> since they hated knowledge and did not choose to fear the LORD.
- <sup>30</sup> Since they would not accept my advice and spurned my rebuke,
- <sup>31</sup> they will eat the fruit of their ways and be filled with the fruit of their schemes.
- <sup>32</sup> For the waywardness of the simple will kill them, and the complacency of fools will destroy them;
- <sup>33</sup> but whoever listens to me will live in safety and be at ease, without fear of harm." [NIV]

# Proverbs 3:11-12

- <sup>11</sup> My son, do not despise the LORD's discipline, and do not resent his rebuke,
- $^{\rm 12}$  because the LORD disciplines those he loves, as a father the son he delights in.  $_{\it /NIVI}$

# Proverbs 15:31-32

- <sup>31</sup> Whoever heeds life-giving correction will be at home among the wise.
- <sup>32</sup> Those who disregard discipline despise themselves, but the one who heeds correction gains understanding. *INIV*7

# Proverbs 19:25

<sup>25</sup> Flog a mocker, and the simple will learn prudence; rebuke the discerning, and they will gain knowledge. [NIV]
