Proverbs 10:19

Proverbs 11:12

¹² Whoever derides their neighbor has no sense,

but the one who has understanding holds their tongue. [NIV]

Proverbs 12:18

18 The words of the reckless pierce like swords,

but the tongue of the wise brings healing. $_{\mbox{\tiny INIV}\mbox{\tiny I}}$

Proverbs 13:3

³Those who guard their lips preserve their lives,

but those who speak rashly will come to ruin. [NIV]

Say a quick prayer after you read it and ask God to help you put it into action.
