1. As we start this new sermon series "Why Am I Here?," it's important to pause and understand just how much God values each and every one of us. As you read through the following verses, how do they speak to how much God cares for us?

#### Romans 5:8 New International Version (NIV)

8 But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

### 1 John 4:9-11 New International Version (NIV)

<sup>9</sup> This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him. <sup>10</sup> This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. <sup>11</sup> Dear friends, since God so loved us, we also ought to love one another.

## Psalm 139:1-18 New International Version (NIV)

For the director of music. Of David. A psalm.

<sup>1</sup>You have searched me, Lord,

and you know me.

<sup>2</sup> You know when I sit and when I rise;

you perceive my thoughts from afar.

<sup>3</sup> You discern my going out and my lying down; you are familiar with all my ways.

<sup>4</sup> Before a word is on my tongue you, Lord, know it completely.

<sup>5</sup> You hem me in behind and before, and you lay your hand upon me.

<sup>6</sup> Such knowledge is too wonderful for me,

too lofty for me to attain.

<sup>7</sup>Where can I go from your Spirit?

Where can I flee from your presence?

<sup>8</sup> If I go up to the heavens, you are there;

if I make my bed in the depths, you are there.

<sup>11</sup> If I say, "Surely the darkness will hide me and the light become night around me,"

<sup>12</sup> even the darkness will not be dark to you; the night will shine like the day, for darkness is as light to you.

<sup>13</sup> For you created my inmost being;

you knit me together in my mother's womb.

<sup>14</sup> I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made;

your works are wonderful,

I know that full well.

<sup>15</sup> My frame was not hidden from you

when I was made in the secret place,

when I was woven together in the depths of the earth.

<sup>16</sup> Your eyes saw my unformed body;

all the days ordained for me were written in your book

before one of them came to be.

<sup>17</sup> How precious to me are your thoughts, <sup>[a]</sup> God! How vast is the sum of them!

<sup>18</sup> Were I to count them,

they would outnumber the grains of sand—when I awake, I am still with you.
