# Life Group Study Questions

For the week of October 13, 2019

### QUICK REVIEW

Looking back at your notes from this week's teaching, was there anything you heard for the first time, caught your attention, challenged or confused you?

#### **MY STORY**

1. Larry talked about using the Bible to hammer other Christians. Have you ever been on the receiving end of someone using the Bible as a hammer? How did that feel?

Of the six wrong ways Larry mentioned we can use the Bible, which of them would be easiest for you to fall into?

2. How has your attitude about the Bible and how you read/study/listen to it changed over the years?

#### **DIGGING DEEPER**

1. Psalm 119 is the longest chapter in the Bible and 171 of its 176 verses contain a reference to God's Word. This Psalm gives us an inside look at how the writer, King David, used the Scriptures to stay connected with God in the midst of chaotic life circumstances. As you read through the various sections of this Psalm:

- 1. **Circle** / **highlight** any words or phrases that catch your attention.
- 2. Underline what you think is important to remember.
- 3. **Put an X** next to anything that confuses you.

**vs 1-8** <sup>1</sup>Blessed are those whose ways are blameless, who walk according to the law of the Lord. <sup>2</sup>Blessed are those who keep his statutes and seek him with all their heart— <sup>3</sup> they do no wrong but follow his ways. <sup>4</sup>You have laid down precepts that are to be fully obeyed. <sup>5</sup>Oh, that my ways were steadfast in obeying your decrees! <sup>6</sup>Then I would not be put to shame when I consider all your commands. <sup>7</sup>I will praise you with an upright heart as I learn your righteous laws.<sup>8</sup>I will obey your decrees; do not utterly forsake me.

vs. 9-16<sup>9</sup> How can a young person stay on the path of purity? By living according to your word. <sup>10</sup> I seek you with all my heart; do not let me stray from your commands. <sup>11</sup> I have hidden your word in my heart that I might not sin against you. <sup>12</sup> Praise be to you, Lord; teach me your decrees. <sup>13</sup> With my lips I recount all the laws that come from your mouth. <sup>14</sup> I rejoice in following your statutes as one rejoices in great riches. <sup>15</sup> I meditate on your precepts and consider your ways. <sup>16</sup> I delight in your decrees; I will not neglect your word.

**vs. 65-72** <sup>65</sup> Do good to your servant according to your word, Lord. <sup>66</sup> Teach me knowledge and good judgment, for I trust your commands. <sup>67</sup> Before I was afflicted I went astray, but now I obey your word. <sup>68</sup> You are good, and what you do is good; teach me your decrees. <sup>69</sup> Though the arrogant have smeared me with lies, I keep your precepts with all my heart. <sup>70</sup> Their hearts are callous and unfeeling, but I delight in your law. <sup>71</sup> It was good for me to be afflicted so that I might learn your decrees. <sup>72</sup> The law from your mouth is more precious to me than thousands of pieces of silver and gold.

What attitudes and actions do you see David maintaining to keep God's Word active in his life?

Which of David's attitudes toward God's Word can you relate to the most? Which is most foreign to you?

Looking back at what you wrote, are there any of these actions or attitudes you might want to consider adopting when it comes to keeping Scripture an active part of your life?

2. Humility is a very important character trait for helping us stay teachable and less likely to use the Bible in "bad" ways. When we are proud we do the opposite. What do you learn about pride and humility from the following passages? (NIV – New International Version)

Proverbs 11:2 - When pride comes, then comes disgrace, but with humility comes wisdom.

Proverbs 16:18 - Pride goes before destruction, a haughty spirit before a fall.

**Romans 12:3** - For by the grace given me I say to every one of you: Do not think of yourself more highly than you ought, but rather think of yourself with sober judgment, in accordance with the faith God has distributed to each of you.

**1 Peter 5:5-7** - In the same way, you who are younger, submit yourselves to your elders. All of you, clothe yourselves with humility toward one another, because, "God opposes the proud but shows favor to the humble." <sup>6</sup> Humble yourselves, therefore, under God's mighty hand, that he may lift you up in due time. <sup>7</sup> Cast all your anxiety on him because he cares for you.

Looking back at each of the six ways the Bible can go bad, how would each of these particular "ways" be impacted by humility?

Humility is often defined as an accurate view of ourselves - including our strengths, weaknesses and limitations. Do you think humility in our interactions with others is similar or different from humility in our relationship with God?
