- 1. **EVERYTHING** belongs to **GOD**Exodus 19:5, Psalm 24:1, 1 Corinthians 10:26
- 2. Money is an **INSTRUMENT** of **WORSHIP** *Matthew 6:24, Luke 16:11-12*
- 3. Giving is **WORSHIP** and **OBEDIENCE** 2 Samuel 24:24, Romans 12
- 4. Money is our **PRIMARY VALUE INDICATOR** *Luke 12:34*

SIX wrong attitudes regarding giving

- 1. Giving is TRANSACTIONAL
- 2. Giving is **MEMBER** dues
- 3. Giving is for the CHURCH
- 4. Giving as a right to **INFLUENCE**
- Giving as a STRATEGY to feel better about WEALTH GUILT
- 6. Giving as **PACIFICATION**

FIVE questions we tend to ask about generosity

- 1. What should I do with MY stuff?
- 2. What should I do with GOD'S stuff?
- 3. What does **GOD** want **ME** to do with my stuff?
- 4. What does **GOD** want **ME** to give from what He has **GIVEN** me?
- 5. What would GOD have me KEEP from what He's BLESSED me with and ENTRUSTED me to steward?

Giving is not what God wants **FROM** you, it's what He wants **FOR** you.

QUICK REVIEW

1. We've all received gifts over the years. We may have known some were coming, while others were a total surprise. Can you remember a gift that was a complete surprise and you greatly appreciated? If so, explain.

2. Talking about money can quickly become uncomfortable especially in a public setting. What do you think was the first thought most people had when Christopher introduced the topic? How about your first thoughts?

DIGGING DEEPER

- 1. Understanding what it means to give joyfully, generously and sacrificially is no small challenge. What do we learn from Paul's words about the Macedonian church's approach to giving? How were they able to put all three of these character qualities into action? As you read about the Macedonian church in 2 Corinthians 8:1-15 use the following prompts:
 - 1. **Circle / highlight** any words or phrases that catch your attention.
 - 2. **Underline** what you think is important to remember.
 - 3. **Put an X** next to anything that confuses you.

And now, brothers and sisters, we want you to know about the grace that God has given the Macedonian churches. ² In the midst of a very severe trial, their overflowing joy and their extreme poverty welled up in rich generosity. ³ For I testify that they gave as much as they were able, and even beyond their ability. Entirely on their own, ⁴ they urgently pleaded with us for the privilege of sharing in this service to the Lord's people. ⁵ And they exceeded our expectations: They gave themselves first of all to the Lord, and then by the will of God also to us. ⁶ So we urged Titus, just as he had earlier made a beginning, to bring also to completion this act of grace on your part. ⁷ But since you excel in everything—in faith, in

speech, in knowledge, in complete earnestness and in the love we have kindled in you—see that you also excel in this grace of giving.

⁸I am not commanding you, but I want to test the sincerity of your love by comparing it with the earnestness of others. ⁹For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sake he became poor, so that you through his poverty might become rich.

¹⁰ And here is my judgment about what is best for you in this matter. Last year you were the first not only to give but also to have the desire to do so. ¹¹ Now finish the work, so that your eager willingness to do it may be matched by your completion of it, according to your means. ¹² For if the willingness is there, the gift is acceptable according to what one has, not according to what one does not have.

¹³ Our desire is not that others might be relieved while you are hard pressed, but that there might be equality. ¹⁴ At the present time your plenty will supply what they need, so that in turn their plenty will supply what you need. The goal is equality, ¹⁵ as it is written: "The one who gathered much did not have too much, and the one who gathered little did not have too little."

How would you summarize Paul's perspective on giving in this passage?

What do you think it looks like to excel in the grace of giving?

What in this passage are you most challenged by or encouraged to put into action?

2. One of the keys to building generosity into our lives is learning to be content with what we have. As most of us know, this kind of contentment can be a challenge. What insight and hope does Paul give us in moving toward this kind of contentment?

¹⁰ I rejoiced greatly in the Lord that at last you renewed your concern for me. Indeed, you were concerned, but you had no opportunity to show it. ¹¹ I am not saying this because I am in need, for I have learned to be content whatever the circumstances. ¹² I know what it is to be in need, and I know what it is to have plenty. I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation, whether well fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or in want. ¹³ I can do all this through him who gives me strength.

Are you not much more valuable than they? ²⁷ Can any one of you by worrying add a single hour to your life?
