DIGGING DEEPER

1. This weekend Larry talked about how we don't get to pick our brothers and sisters. The prophet Jonah is an example of someone who wanted to keep his enemies out of the family of God. As you read Jonah's story, what are some possible reasons Jonah was so angry at the Ninevites? What didn't he understand about God that caused his anger?

What are some hurdles you might face in wanting your "enemies" to know God and receive His love and forgiveness?

How might remembering Titus 3:3-7 and 1 Corinthians 1:26-30 help you overcome those hurdles and welcome others into the family of God?

Titus 3:3-7 New International Version (NIV)

³ At one time we too were foolish, disobedient, deceived and enslaved by all kinds of passions and pleasures. We lived in malice and envy, being hated and hating one another. ⁴ But when the kindness and love of God our Savior appeared, ⁵ he saved us, not because of righteous things we had done, but because of his mercy. He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, ⁶ whom he poured out on us generously through Jesus Christ our Savior, ⁷ so that, having been justified by his grace, we might become heirs having the hope of eternal life.

1 Corinthians 1:26-30 New International Version (NIV)

²⁶ Brothers and sisters, think of what you were when you were called. Not many of you were wise by human standards; not many were influential; not many were of noble birth. ²⁷ But God chose the foolish things of the world to shame the wise; God chose the weak things of the world to shame the strong. ²⁸ God chose the lowly things of this world and the despised things—and the things that are not—to nullify the things that are, ²⁹ so that no one may boast before him. ³⁰ It is because of him that you are in Christ Jesus, who has become for us wisdom from God—that is, our righteousness, holiness and redemption.

In Matthew 5:44, Jesus tells His disciples to pray for those who persecute them. If you were to pray for someone who is your "enemy" as Larry defined it in his message, what would you pray for them? (Write your prayer below).

Matthew 5:44 New International Version (NIV)

⁴⁴ But I tell you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you...

2. Larry mentioned the essential role of a renewed mind when it comes to loving our enemies. Renewing our minds involves focusing on what God desires and thinking like Christ rather than like the world, culture or our natural way of thinking. How do these verses reinforce the idea of being like Christ by renewing our minds?

Romans 8:5-6 New International Version (NIV)

⁵ Those who live according to the flesh have their minds set on what the flesh desires; but those who live in accordance with the Spirit have their minds set on what the Spirit desires. ⁶ The mind governed by the flesh is death, but the mind governed by the Spirit is life and peace.

Ephesians 4:22-24 New International Version (NIV)

²²You were taught, with regard to your former way of life, to put off your old self, which is being corrupted by its deceitful desires; ²³ to be made new in the attitude of your minds; ²⁴ and to put on the new self, created to be like God in true righteousness and holiness.

Colossians 3:7-11 New International Version (NIV)

⁷ You used to walk in these ways, in the life you once lived. ⁸ But now you must also rid yourselves of all such things as these: anger, rage, malice, slander, and filthy language from your lips. ⁹ Do not lie to each other, since you have taken off your old self with its practices ¹⁰ and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge in the image of its Creator. ¹¹ Here there is no Gentile or Jew, circumcised or uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave or free, but Christ is all, and is in all.

Is there an aspect of God's character you can set your mind on that will help you to better love someone who is difficult for you to love?

3. Think of two or three people you view as being in the wrong about something. Is your response to them more like Jonah's response to the Ninevites or Ananias' response to Saul?

Is there something you can do this week to respond more like Ananias to these people?
